



[HB 1363](#) (2) [Kidd, Bill E.\(R\)](#) Requires teachers and principals to complete two hours of suicide prevention education each school year.

General Remarks: H&MH. Support. Suicide prevention education for teachers and principals. Mental health community taking the lead.

[HB 1410](#) (2) [Fitzpatrick, Scott\(R\)](#) Extends the expiration date on various federal reimbursement allowances for two years.

General Remarks: H&MH. Support. The Federal Reimbursement Allowance (FRA) is an essential part of health care financing in Missouri.

[HB 1419](#) (2) [Haefner, Marsha\(R\)](#) Requires certain health care professionals to complete two hours of suicide prevention training as a condition of licensure.

General Remarks: H&MH. Support. Requires certain mental health professionals to receive suicide prevention education annually.

[HB 1619](#) (2) [Rehder, Holly\(R\)](#) Establishes the Narcotics Control Act

General Remarks: H&MH. Establishes prescription drug monitoring. Our members are divided on this issue, but many support. Many working in substance abuse see this as one step in responding to the opioid addiction crisis.

[HB 1620](#) [Rehder, Holly\(R\)](#) Exempts health care entities registered with the Department of Health and Senior Services that distribute hypodermic needles or syringes from the crime of unlawful delivery of drug paraphernalia

General Remarks: H&MH. Support. Needle and syringe exchange programs can reduce transmission of diseases and also promote relationships with health care professionals that encourage attempts to enter recovery from addictions.

[HB 1626](#) [Morris, Lynn\(R\)](#) Establishes the Tricia Leann Tharp Act, which requires certain pharmacists to receive two hours of continuing education on suicide prevention.

General Remarks: H&MH. Support. Offers continuing education to pharmacists in suicide prevention.

[HB 1627](#) [Evans, Jean\(R\)](#) Establishes protections for pregnant offenders and offenders who are in postpartum recovery while in custody at a correctional center or county or city jail.

General Remarks: H&MH, CJ, HR. Support. Establishes protections for pregnant and postpartum offenders while in custody in prisons or city or county jails, including guidelines related to use of restraints.

[HB 1628](#) [Evans, Jean\(R\)](#) Prohibits the prosecution of minor children for prostitution and requires patrons of child prostitutes to register as sex offenders.

General Remarks: HR, CJ, H&MH. Support. Children are human trafficking victims and should not be charged with crimes as prostitutes.

[HB 1747](#) [Wood, David\(R\)](#) Extends the expiration date on various federal reimbursement allowances.

General Remarks: H&MH. Support. The Federal Reimbursement Allowance is a major source of funding for health care in Missouri.

[HB 2120](#) [Barnes-60, Jason\(R\)](#) Expands MO HealthNet benefits for pregnant women to provide substance abuse treatment for up to two years after giving birth.

General Remarks: H&MH. Support. Expands eligibility for MO HealthNet for pregnant women and includes up to two years of substance abuse treatment after birth.

Last Action: 1-25-18 H Referred to House Committee on House-Health and Mental Health Policy

[SB 562](#) [Sater, David\(R\)](#) Requires the Department of Social Services to apply for a global waiver for MO HealthNet

General Remarks: H&MH. Oppose. A Medicaid global waiver could lead to block grants or per capita caps, depriving persons of coverage or care.
