- General Remarks:** HR, EJ&H. Oppose. Forced arbitration takes away important employee protections. Persons desperate for jobs may not understand what they are losing by signing an arbitration agreement or may feel they have no alternative given their need for employment.

- [HB 1627](#) [Evans, Jean\(R\)](#) Establishes protections for pregnant offenders and offenders who are in postpartum recovery while in custody at a correctional center or county or city jail.
- General Remarks:** H&MH, CJ, HR. Support. Establishes protections for pregnant and postpartum offenders while in custody in prisons or city or county jails, including guidelines related to use of restraints.

[HB 1628](#) [Evans, Jean\(R\)](#) Prohibits the prosecution of minor children for prostitution and requires patrons of child prostitutes to register as sex offenders.

**General Remarks:** HR, CJ, H&MH. Support. Children are human trafficking victims and should not be charged with crimes as prostitutes.

**General Remarks:** HR, CJ. Support. Our Human Rights Task Force has worked with the sponsor and allies on language for this bill in multiple years. Seeks to improve data in the Vehicle Stops Report and strengthen Missouri's laws against racial profiling in policing.

**General Remarks:** HR, CJ. Support. Our Board of Directors passed a policy in support of marijuana legalization in 2014 that also included language to lift restrictions on hemp production. Hemp is a valuable agricultural product for Missouri that does not pose threats connected to drug addiction.
